Alfonso de Prat Gay is a former Minister of the Treasury and Public Finances of Argentina. He currently sits on the Board of the President Foundation. He was President of the Central Bank of Argentina from December 2002 to September 2004 and was elected National Deputy for the Civic Coalition in the 2009 elections.

Amgad Faried Eltayeb Idris, CEO, Fikra Center for Studies and Development, Egypt

Amgad Faried Eltayeb Idris is the CEO of Fikra Center for Studies and Development, an organization that aims to expand the frontiers of knowledge and facilitate political and social transformation by redefining discourse on public matters. He previously served in the position of Assistant Chief of Staff to the Prime Minister of Sudan, Dr. Abdalla Hamdok.

Branko Brkic is the Editor-in-Chief of Daily Maverick, South Africa's leading independent media organisation. He started his career by publishing science fiction books in 1984 in then Yugoslavia. Over time, he went from being a project-based book publisher to starting Yugoslavia's biggest privately-owned publishing house, where he published 62 books.

After serving as Commander of the Botswana Defence Force, he entered politics and was Vice-President of Botswana from 1998 to 2008, then succeeded Festus Mogae as President on 1 April 2008. He won a full term in the 2009 election and was re-elected in October 2014.

Ibrahim Al-bakri Nyei, Director, Ducor ISER, Liberia

Ibrahim Al-Bakri Nyei is a Liberian researcher and political analyst at the Ducor Institute for Social and Economic Research in Liberia and a fellow at the Center for Democracy and Development (CDD) West Africa in Nigeria.

Ivone Soares, Member of Parliament, RENAMO, Mozambique

Ivone Soares is a Mozambican politician and Member of Parliament, an University Lecturer of Political Science and International Relations, a published poet, a media commentator, and a newspapers columnist. Since 2020 she has served in the Mozambican parliament as Vice President of the Ethics Committee. She previously served as the RENAMO party Chief whip.

Janusz Lewandowski, Member of the European Parliament, fmr Privatisation Minister, Poland

Janusz Lewandowski is a Polish politician and economist belonging to the Gdansk liberals group, and a member of the European Parliament. He served as the Chairman of the Committee on Budgets, among others. He was also a former privatisation minister in Poland.

Jawar Mohammed, Founder, Oromia Media Network, Ethiopia

Jawar Mohammed is an Ethiopian political analyst and activist. One of the founders of the Oromia Media Network (OMN), Jawar was a leading organizer of the 2014–2016 Oromo protests.

Jędrzej Czerep, Head, Polish Institute of International Affairs, Poland

Jędrzej Czerep is an analyst for Sub-Saharan Africa in the Middle East and Africa program. He has collaborated with think tanks (K. Pulaski Foundation, Royal United Services Institute), international organizations (Council of Europe), media (Al-Jazeera, The Guardian), and administration (Office for Foreigners, Border Guard). He has conducted research in South Sudan (2011), Nigeria (2015), Tanzania (2018), and Sudan (2019).

John Githongo, CEO, Inuka, Kenya

John Githongo is the CEO of Inuka, an NGO involved in governance issues in Kenya. He formerly served as Chairman of the Africa Institute for Governing with Integrity, Executive Vice-Chair of the Mathare Youth Sports Association (MYSA), and Chair board member of the Africa Centre for Open Governance (AFRICOG). He has also served as a board member of the Kenya Human Rights Commission.

John Steenhuisen, Leader, Democratic Alliance, South Africa

John Steenhuisen is a South African politician who has served as Leader of the Opposition since October 2019 and has been the leader of the Democratic Alliance since November 2020, having served as the interim leader for one year from November 2019. He was chief whip of the official opposition from May 2014 until October 2019.

Juan Carlos Pinzón, Former Defence Minister

& Ambassador of Colombia to the United States, Colombia Juan Carlos Pinzón Bueno is a Colombian diplomat, politician and economist. He is the current Ambassador of Colombia to the United States and former Minister of Defence. Under his leadership as Minister of Defence, the armed forces dealt the most severe blows to terrorist organizations and criminal bands, highly degrading their capabilities, structure, and leadership. This resulted in improved security conditions throughout the country and the lowest homicide rate in 35 years.

Kizza Besigye, President, Forum for Democratic Change, Uganda

Kizza Besigye is a Ugandan physician, politician, and former military officer in the Uganda People's Defence Force. He served as the President of the Forum for Democratic Change (FDC) political party and was an unsuccessful candidate in Uganda's 2001, 2006, 2011, and 2016 presidential elections.

Lech Wałęsa, Former President, Poland

Lech Wałęsa is a Polish statesman, dissident, and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, who served as the President of Poland between 1990 and 1995. After winning the 1990 election, Wałęsa became Poland's first democratically elected President since 1926 and the first-ever Polish President elected by popular vote. Wałęsa became the leader of the Solidarity movement and led a successful pro-democratic effort, which in 1989 ended Communist rule in Poland and ushered in the end of the Cold War.

Leila Jack, Programme Manager, The Brenthurst Foundation, South Africa

Leila Jack is the Programme Manager at the Brenthurst Foundation. Before joining the Foundation, she worked at the then-University of Natal's International Office before joining the South African Institute of International Affairs (SAIIA) as the Programme Manager and Assistant to the National Director and later as the Director of Operations.

Leopoldo Lopèz, Opposition Leader, Venezuela

Leopoldo Mendoza is a Venezuelan opposition leader. He co-founded the political party Primero Justicia in 2000 and was elected mayor of the Chacao Municipality of Caracas in the regional elections held in July 2000. He is the National Coordinator of another political party, Voluntad Popular, which he founded in 2009. He fled Venezuela in October 2020.

Luis Franceschi, Assistant Secretary General, The Commonwealth, UK

Luis Franceschi is the Assistant Secretary General of the Commonwealth. He coordinates the Political, Democracy, Electoral, Public Sector Governance, Good Offices, Rule of Law, Judicial Transformation, Human Rights, and Countering Violence and Extremism work in the 56 member countries. He is also the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting – CHOGM Conference Secretary.

Macdella Cooper, Political Leader, Movement for One Liberia

MacDella Cooper is a Liberian politician and philanthropist. She is the Standard Bearer of The Movement for One Liberia (MOL) political party. Cooper worked as an international businesswoman for several years before founding the MacDella Cooper Foundation, the MacDella Cooper Academy, and the Movement for One Liberia political party.

Moeketsi Majoro, former Prime Minister, Lesotho

Moeketsi Majoro is a former Prime Minister of Lesotho and a former Former Minister of Finance and Development Planning in Lesotho. He also formerly served as a senator and the minister of Development Planning from 2013 to 2015. Before joining the Government of the Kingdom of Lesotho as Minister and MP, he served as executive director at the International Monetary Fund representing 21 African countries on the Executive Board (2008-2012).

Oleksandr Plodysti, General Consul, Embassy of Ukraine, Poland

Oleksandr Plodysti is the current Consul General at the Consulate of Ukraine in Gdansk, Poland.

Oleksandra Matviichuk,

Ukraine's Center for Civil Liberties, Ukraine

Olusegun Obasanjo is a former President of Nigeria. With more than 30 books in print covering various topics, he pursues a passion for conflict resolution, mediation and development through multiple institutions. In addition, President Obasanjo has a distinguished military career, including serving in the 1957 U.N. Peacekeeping Mission to Congo and receiving the instrument of surrender on behalf of the Nigerian Government from the opposing forces in the Nigerian Civil War in 1970. He currently serves as the A.U High Representative for the Horn of Africa region, among other positions, including Board Chairman of the Brenthurst Foundation.

Ray Hartley, Research Director, The Brenthurst Foundation, South Africa

Ray formerly served as editor of South African newspapers and online publications, including the Sunday Times, The Times, Rand Daily Mail and BusinessLIVE. He was an anti-apartheid activist in the United Democratic Front while serving on the executive of the National Union of South African Students. He later worked for the Human Awareness Programme, an NGO that provided activists with training and advice.

Roelf Meyer, CEO, In Transformation, South Africa

Roelf was intimately involved in settling the South African conflict as Chief Negotiator for the National Party Government. After the 1994 elections, Meyer continued in his post of Minister of Constitutional Affairs in the Cabinet of President Nelson Mandela. He now serves as C.E.O. of In Transformation, which promotes the principles of the South African peacemaking model to support, advise and assist democratic transitions and resolution of conflicts in Africa and worldwide.

Roland Freudenstein, Vice-President, Globsec, Belgium

Roland Freudenstein is Vice President and Head of GLOB-SEC Brussels. Previously and since 2008, he was Policy Director of the Wilfried Martens Centre for European Studies, the think tank of the European People's Party in Brussels. Previously active in the think tank world (German Council on Foreign Relations), global democracy support (Konrad Adenauer Foundation) and public service (European Commission and Hamburg State Government).

Sanyaolu Ayowole Oluwajuwon, African Action Congress, Nigeria

Sanyaolu Ayowole Oluwajuwon is with the African Action Congress (AAC), a left-wing, Nigerian political party created by a Nigerian 2019 presidential aspirant and Publisher at Sahara Reporters, Omoyele Sowore.

Velenkosini Hlabisa, President, Inkatha Freedom Party, South Africa

Velenkosini Fiki Hlabisa MPL is a South African politician and former teacher who has been the President of the Inkatha Freedom Party (IFP) and the Leader of the fourth-largest political party in the Republic of South Africa and the Official Opposition in the KwaZulu-Natal since 2019. While studying at the University of Zululand, he became a founding member and first Chairperson of the South African Democratic Students' Movement at the University.

Venâncio Mondlane, MP, RENAMO, Mozambique

Venâncio Mondlane is an Mozambican member of parliament with the RENAMO party. He formerly served as the rapporteur of the parliamentary group of the opposition Mozambique Democratic Movement (MDM).

Yulia Tymoshenko, former Prime Minister, Ukraine

Yulia Tymoshenko is a Ukrainian politician. She co-led the Orange Revolution and was the first woman appointed Prime Minister of Ukraine, serving from 24 January to 8 September 2005, and again from December 2007 to March 2010. She trained as an engineer and economist in the East and, when the Soviet Union broke up, sought to take advantage of the business opportunities that emerged. In the mid-1990s, she formed United Energy Systems of Ukraine, which helped supply gas to Ukraine's huge industrial base.

Zitto Kabwe, Leader, ACT-Wazalendo, Tanzania

Zitto Kabwe is a Tanzanian politician who serves as the leader of the opposition party, Alliance for Change and Transparency (ACT-Wazalendo). He served as a two-term Parliament Member for the Kigoma North constituency from 2005 to 2015. He was also the Chairman of the Parliamentary Public Accounts Committee (P.A.C.) and the chair of the parliamentary standing committee, where he oversaw more than 250 State-Owned Companies.
